KS2 Years 3 - 6 Teaching Session - 90 minutes

Objectives

- * To explore the variety of children's toys during this period, as well as considering the restrictions imposed by materials and mechanisms and how this influenced play.
- * To investigate the contrast between the lives of the wealthy and the poor, including child labour.
- * To help develop an understanding of the significant events, inventions and discoveries which influenced toy manufacture and play during this period.
- * To gain an understanding of how information is obtained through a variety of sources and to use appropriate vocabulary and adjectives.

Teaching Activities

Introduction

A background to the Victorian era. What do children already know about significant events during this period?

Activity 1

Gallery investigation – in groups, children search for key objects amongst the museum exhibits, with picture prompts and focus questions, recording their findings.

Activity 2

Discovery tables, to include handling objects with focus questions.

Activity 3

Presentation of findings and discussion, focusing on our objectives. Construction of a time-line.

Plenary

Evaluation – what have we learnt? Compare toys and play during the Victorian era with that of the present day. Further gallery investigation – a look at toys during the Edwardian period and up until WW1.
